Subject:	City Manager's Report

1. Planning & Development.

a. Reconstruction of 1 Brookmeadow. The demolition inspection is complete, and a permit will be issued for reconstruction once the contractor has supplied evidence of registration for an Architectural Barriers plan review and inspection and an Asbestos Survey has been accepted by the City.

b. Site Development of Camp Young Judea. The deadline of December 29th for submission of a conforming Site Plan for consideration by the P&Z and Council passed. The City staff will offer Council a recommendation for reversing the permit denial.

c. The owner of Lots 9 and 10, Oak Orchard Enclave, replatted the properties into a single plat. However, offsetting side setbacks have become an issue between Lots 8 and 9, as both assert a 5' setback, which is not recorded in the plat and is contrary to the Development Agreement. A foundation was due to be poured tomorrow.

d. The P&Z Commission met December 4th, accepting the task from Council to draft the changes proposed to the Zoning Ordinance to streamline fence permits along the golf course.

2. Public Safety. The Constable's Report for December 2014 is attached. Deputy Constable Helm has begun duty serving the City. The next Municipal Court is set for January 15, 2015.

3. Code Enforcement. The builder of the residence at 30 Stonehouse Circle has submitted an acceptable design for a hard surface driveway that is partially permeable, as well as a draft of a request for variance to impervious cover.

4. HR. The City hired Willard "Nate" Raiford to serve an internship as its Deputy City Planner. On February 6th, I will attend the Texas Workforce Commission training for HR administration.

5. Cypress Creek Watershed Protection Plan. The TCEQ has requested each public entity stakeholder provide a letter of commitment to the final plan it is submitting to the EPA.

6. Professional Services. The Source Selection Evaluation Board for the Municipal Engineering Services RFQ will offer a recommendation today.

7. Newsletter. The Winter 2015 newsletter is at the printers, and a copy has been loaded to the City website.

- 5.) Public Comments: Judy Brizendine asked to hold her remarks for the agenda item dealing with golf carts. Matt Lowry asked to reserve comment for the Board of Adjustment portion of the meeting.
- 6.) Citizen Communications: There were no citizen communications.

7.) Report Items:

- A. Director of Public Works Wood was absent.
- B. City Manager Sone presented the City Treasurer's report which showed Year-to-date revenue of \$98,091.00 and \$51,807.00 in expenses.
- C. City Engineer David Fusilier, reporting via telephone, on the Review of the Site Development Permit application for Camp Young Judea, stated that the major issue regarding approval of the Experiential Learning Center is that the project engineer had not calculated the water demands of the proposed building and campus, to which the water provider could then commit to supply. CYJ engineers have not provided this information as well as clarification on other design aspects of the plan. He added that the Emergency Services District had not determined that the fire protection planning was sufficient.
- D. The City Manager provided a monthly report of significant events.
- E. Mayor Steinert gave a Citizen Advisory Committee Update: The Roads and Streets Committee is expecting a report and recommendations by the end of December from the engineer that was retained; the Parks Committee is discussing grant requirements with LCRA.

Mayor Pro Tem Britner moved to accept the Consent Agenda in its entirety. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Maldonado, which passed with a vote of 5-0-0.

9.) Regular Agenda

- **A.** After discussion, Council agreed to table discussion of a draft ordinance for regulation of parking in public spaces until its January meeting.
- **B.** After discussion, Mayor Pro Tem Britner moved to distribute the remainder of the Hotel Occupancy Tax fund by making a \$3000.00 contribution for sponsorship of the VFW Post 6441 July 4th Pro Rodeo and Fireworks Display, and then to split the remaining funds between the Jacobs Well Natural Area Visitor Information Center and the Wimberley Valley Visitor Information Center. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Maldonado, which passed with a vote of 5-0-0.
- **C.** The Council discussed a partial set of proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances to implement the recommendations of the Mayor's Task Force on Off-street Parking, noting that the remaining amendments had yet to be drafted.
- **D.** After discussion of directing the staff to prepare legislation limiting the operation of golf carts on public streets, no action was taken.

10.) Board of Adjustment

a. Application for Variance to the Woodcreek Code of Ordinances, § 156.058, by Matt Lowry, doing business as Somerset Homes Inc, owner of lot 197, Woodcreek Section 2, for a variance to § 156.063 (B) (1) of the Woodcreek Code of Ordinances for a proposed dwelling to reduce the north side setback from 7.5 feet to 6 feet, and the south side setback from 7.5 feet to 5 feet. The address of the proposed structure is 11 Palmer Lane.

Page 2 of 3

Staff Report: Mr. Lowry applied for a variance to a side setback in order to preserve an oak tree on the property. Notices to property owners within 200 feet for the public hearings of the application were mailed October 30, 2014. The application did not describe the "usual and practical difficulties or particular hardship" caused by the strict application of the Zoning Ordinance. The views of the adjacent property owners had not been presented by the applicant. City staff provided a letter which had been signed by the owners of 8, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 23 Palmer Lane objecting to the variance, alleging it would be contrary to the public interest in that it would adversely affect an environment already challenged by drainage. Because no hardship has been identified, no express public good envisioned, and an undesirable precedent in reducing setbacks between structures, the City Staff did not recommend approval of the application. At its December 4th meeting, the Planning and Zoning Commission voted unanimously to recommend disapproval (5-0-0). Public Hearing Open: 7:25 p.m. Matt Lowry said he would have to build a smaller house to fit around the tree if the variance is not granted. Closed: 7:35 p.m.

Subject: Site Development Plan Review for Camp Young Judea - Staff Report

The City provided a review of Camp Young Judea's application for a Site Development Permit to the project engineer, Matkin-Hoover, on October 2, 2014. The most substantial shortcomings in the plan were:

1. A professionally sealed engineering report (or design analysis) was requested to accompany the plans.

- 2. Confirmation of water utility capacity to meet the aggregate demand was requested.
- 3. A signature block indicating review by the Hays County Emergency Services District #4

Based on the City Engineer's and my review of the latest plan documentation from Matkin-Hoover dated December 3, 2014, I concluded that the application remained incomplete sixty days after original notice. My ministerial responsibility required that I administratively deny the application per § 154.065 of the Woodcreek Code of Ordinances, which I did by letter on December 10, 2014, with a copy of the City Engineer's review of the December 3rd iteration of the project. The letter stated the timeline for hearings and review by the Planning and Zoning Commission and this body. Per § 154.065 the applicant had until December 29th to submit a complete site development plan in order for the Commission to factor that into its recommendation. This was a vital window as the City Engineer's firm closed its Austin office at the end of the year, however no plans were received.

The Mayor and I met with the Executive Director of Camp Young Judea on December 18th to communicate the City's seriousness about correcting the Site Development Plan deficiencies. These deficiencies were the ones the Engineer briefed the City Council on at its December 10th meeting following administrative denial. The ED sent a note of thanks and indicated he planned to expend the resources to make the remedies, in time for tonight's meeting.

By a vote of 5-0-0, the P&Z Commission confirmed the proper management of the application and its denial by the City staff. My recommendation to Council is to make the same confirmation, and to authorize the City Manager, in consultation with the City Engineer, to reverse the denial if the deficiencies have been cured by the end of January.

I have attached the City Engineer's review of the most recent submission by the project engineer.

You should be aware that my action will be reviewed by the City of Woodcreek Planning and Zoning Commission at its next regular meeting on January 5, 2015, beginning at 6:30 pm at the Woodcreek City Hall, 41 Champions Circle, Woodcreek, Texas. The Code of Ordinances provides guidance to both the applicant and me in this regard: "Seven additional copies of the plan that was denied shall be submitted by the applicant to the City Manager/Administrator no later than seven calendar days prior to the P&Z meeting. Copies of the plan resubmitted to the city less than seven days prior to the meeting date shall not be accepted or forwarded to the P&Z until the next month's meeting."

Please stand advised that the seven copies of the current or more recent plan are due to the City of Woodcreek by December 29, 2014, in order to be considered by the next Planning and Zoning Commission meeting. If the plans cure the stated deficiencies, the City staff will recommend the Planning and Zoning Commission favorably consider the application.

Camp Young Judea has been a model of good citizenship in the City. I regret that the process for update of the Site Development Plan has not been smoother.

I have reviewed the construction plan drawings submitted by Matkin Hoover Engineering & Surveying on November 26, 2014, as well as additional information submitted on December 3, 2014. The submitted material included a transmittal page and eleven full-size sheets of construction plans. The updated site plan drawings were submitted in response to the City's previous review memo dated October 2, 2014. All of the eleven plan sheets submitted were approved for review by Aaron Neumann, P.E., dated September 25, 2014, and stamped "...for REVIEW PURPOSES ONLY" and "NOT FOR CONSTRUCTION".

After reviewing the submitted plan sheets, and reviewing the comments from the City's previous comments, I have provided updated comments on the submitted material. My updated comments are shown below in blue. Comments on 12/04/14 are shown in red.

1. A sealed engineering report/summary document needs to be provided for this project. The report does not need to be lengthy, but is should discuss the major items involved in the development of the project including utilities, drainage, floodplain issues, crosion/sedimentation control, tree protection, parking and loading/service areas, fire protection, nature of the proposed developed, and should detail any variances being requested for the proposed project. The document should include a discussion on how ADA access requirements will be addressed. The TCEQ has indicated that a Contributing Zone Plan will not be required at this time. This issue should be covered in the report and a copy of the TCEQ's email discussing this issue should be included as an attachment to the report. Related to drainage issues, the document should include a discussion on why stormwater detention is not being proposed for this project.

No additional materials, either an engineering or a summary document were submitted for review as suggested by the City's original comment. It is unclear whether many of the subject areas outlined in the original comment are adequately addressed by the submitted plans.

The cover page of the Design Analysis should include an engineering seal and should be signed and dated. If the document is not bound, each of the other individual sheets of the Design Analysis should also be sealed, signed, and dated. The Contributing Zone Plan section states that only 0.004 acres of impervious cover has been added, whereas Sheet CS101 shows the Current Proposed (ELC) impervious cover to be 0.187 acres.

The Contributing Zone Plan section refers to an attached TCEQ correspondence – a copy of this correspondence should be provided. The Utilities section refers to an attached November 12, 2014 Aqua Texas letter – a copy of this letter should be included.

The Stormwater Detention section of the Design Analysis states that on-site detention was not required for this site. An explanation of why stormwater detention is not required should be provided by the engineer.

The engineer indicates that this project is designed in accordance with ADA standards. Will the building plans be submitted to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation for review of the project?

2. A complete erosion and sedimentation control plan should be provided. The limits of construction should be identified and the total area denoted on the plans. The plan should include details on the type and location of the controls that will be used during the project. The plan should also specify the method/techniques to be used for re-vegetation and slope stabilization. The plan should detail a post-construction restoration plan. [154.020(B), 154.023]

An erosion and sedimentation control plan and details are shown on Sheets CG801 and CG851. The total area of the limits of the construction should be identified on the plans. The limits of construction should be revised to include the construction staging area, concrete wash out area, and material storage area. Additional details should be provided on the native grass seed mix that will be used for revegetation of disturbed areas. It is noted that utility lines located within the critical root zone of existing trees should be bored as outlined in the TxDOT Tree Protection detail included on Sheet CG851 (instead of an open cut installation).

Comment addressed.

3. The site plan should identify any temporary storage areas for spoils or construction equipment. [154.021(B)]

A materials storage area is shown on the plans along with concrete wash out area and a construction staging area. Is it the engineer's intent that this area will also provide a temporary storage area for spoils and/or construction equipment?

Comment addressed.

4. The site plan should identify the fire lanes and hydrants that will serve the proposed buildings. [154.040(A)(5), 154.102(B)(8)]

The requested information does not appear to be shown on the construction plans.

Fire lanes have not been identified on the plans. The Design Analysis document indicates that a November 12, 2014 letter from Aqua Texas states that the water system was not designed or built to provide fire protection. It is our understanding that the engineer and owner continue to work with the Emergency Services District on their review of the site plan. Sign off by the Emergency Services District will be required prior to City approval of the site plan.

5. The site plan should include landscaping and irrigation plans. [154.040(A)(7)]

The requested information has not been provided.

The engineer indicates that the disturbed areas will be seeded with native grasses. No additional landscaping or irrigation is proposed.

6. A cover sheet should be provided for the plan set submitted to the City. The cover sheet should, at a minimum, include the following: project title; identification of project owner, engineer, architect, utilities that will serve the project; signature blocks for Mayor, City Manager, City Engineer, and local Emergency Services District. A sheet index should also be provided. [154.040(Λ)(13), 154.102(B)(11)]

The cover sheet should be updated to include a signature block for the Mayor and City Engineer, as well as the local Emergency Services District. The City Manager's name is John Sone (not Jeff Stone).

Comment addressed.

7. The design and location of off-street parking and loading facilities for the proposed project should be shown on the plans. If no parking are loading facilities will be constructed as part of this project that fact should be detailed in the engineering report. [154.060(C)(5)]

The requested information has not been provided.

The engineer has indicated that the building will be accessed by pedestrians. Off street parking and loading facilities are not proposed for this project.

8. The engineering report should address the adequacy of water, drainage, sewerage facilities, solid waste disposal and any other utilities that will serve the facility. Note #10 on Sheet CU101 states that "...the utility layout assumes adequate capacity is available on all existing utilities. Capacity to be verified prior to construction." The adequate capacity issue for all utilities should be demonstrated by the applicant prior to the City issuing a site plan or building permit. [154.060(C)(13)]

An engineering report/summary document has not been provided as requested. This comment has not be addressed by the updated construction plans.

Copies of the letters from Aqua Texas dated September 22, 2014 and November 12, 2014 should be provided as indicated. The engineer indicates that Aqua Texas stated that their three inch water line can deliver approximately 250 gallons per minute. No information on the water demands of the existing camp facilities or the proposed buildings were provided. With the information provided it is not possible to determine the adequacy of the water system that will serve the proposed buildings.

9. The plans should more clearly indicate, on one sheet, which existing trees inside the project's limits of construction will be protected and which trees will be removed. It is recommended that the tree table and tree numbers shown on Sheet VF101, be combined with the information shown on Sheet CD101. [154.102(B)(6)]

The requested information has been provided and is now shown on Sheet CG801.

10. The site plan should more clearly show how the project will be served by the existing parking lots and driveways. It is possible the scale for a plan sheet (or sheets) will need to be adjusted to show more of the existing parking areas and driveways. [154.102(B)(7)]

It does not appear that the requested information has been shown on the updated construction plans.

The engineer has shown the parking lots and driveways on the concept plan included as Sheet CS100. The engineer states that access to the building will be by pedestrian traffic. The nearest parking area/roadway appears to be a minimum of 200 feet from the proposed buildings.

11. The height and square footage of the proposed buildings should be shown on the plans, along with loading and service areas. [154.084(B)(8)]

The building square footage is shown on Sheet CS101. It is requested that the height of the proposed buildings also be shown on this sheet.

Sheet CS101 indicates that the building heights will be 129.20 ft. and 121.92 ft. Is this correct?

12. The site plan must be reviewed and approved by the Emergency Services District.

Has this been completed? As requested in comment #6 above, a signature block for the Emergency Services. District should be included on the cover sheet.

The engineer has indicated that this comment is noted. The understanding is that the owner and engineer continue to work with the Emergency Services District on site plan review.

13. A summary of the proposed impervious cover should be included on the plans. This summary should also include the existing impervious cover at Camp Young Judaea and the total impervious cover that will exist after this project is completed.

The requested information is summaries on Sheet CS101 of the construction plans.

Comment addressed.

14. Additional details should be provided on the proposed rainwater collection system.

It does not appear that the requested information has been shown on the updated construction plans.

The engineer indicates that details of the rainwater collection system will be provided with the building plans.

The City received three responses to the Request for Qualifications it issued on December 1, 2014. Procurement of these services is governed by the Texas Government Code, as established in the Professional Services Procurement Act.

Sec. 2254.003. SELECTION OF PROVIDER; FEES.

(a) A governmental entity may not select a provider of professional services or a group or association of providers or award a contract for the services on the basis of competitive bids submitted for the contract or for the services, but shall make the selection and award:

(1) on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications to perform the services; and

(2) for a fair and reasonable price.

(b) The professional fees under the contract may not exceed any maximum provided by law.

The three respondents were: Rogers Design Services, PLLC; C. Rick Coneway, P.E., in association with CobbFendley; and Texas Engineering Solutions, LLC. The City convened a Source Selection Evaluation Board consisting of the Mayor, City Manager, and DPW. The board found each statement of qualifications to be responsive, and each to demonstrate competence and qualifications necessary to perform the City's engineering services. After deliberation, the board unanimously arrived at the following rankings: 1) C. Rick Coneway, P.E.; 2) Texas Engineering Solutions, LLC; 3) Rogers Design Services, LLC.

The Board recommends the Council approve its findings, authorize negotiation with Mr. Coneway to arrive at a fair price, and execute a contract if successful, otherwise to begin negotiation with Texas Engineering Solutions in accordance with Sec. 2254.004 of the Code.

Since 2004 the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) has managed a telephonebased notification system for the benefit of participating jurisdictions. In prior years, participants in the system were required to participate in the funding of system operations by paying a fee. This fee covered a small portion of the operating costs with the balance coming from federal Homeland Security Grant Program funds.

Effective October 1, 2014, the operating costs of the system are being funded by the Capital Area Emergency Communications District (CAECD). CAPCOG's Executive Committee approved this change in its role as the district's Board of Managers. As a result, this service is available without cost to qualifying organizations. I want to make sure that your city is aware of the opportunity to participate in this system.

To help you understand the benefits of the system I have enclosed a copy of our Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document and the most recent copy of the CAPCOG *Regional Notification System (RNS) Policies and Procedures* as approved by the CAPCOG Executive Committee.

Our staff provides initial and ongoing training on the RNS. Personnel from our system vendor are available around the clock to assist your personnel.

Regional Notification System (RNS)

Policies & Procedures

Version 3.2—Effective: October 8, 2014

1. PROGRAM BACKGROUND

- 1.1. The Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) administers and maintains a Regional Notification System (RNS) for jurisdictions in the ten counties (Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis and Williamson) that comprise the CAPCOG region.
- 1.2. The CAPCOG Regional Notification System (RNS), originally known as the CAPCOG Emergency Notification System (ENS), was implemented in 2006 using a combination of federal Homeland Security Grant Program funds and local assessments.
- 1.3. The RNS has been implemented using the FirstCall[®] system, a web-based application provided under contract with FirstCall Network, Inc., Baton Rouge, LA. FirstCall[®] uses a combination of databases, including the 9-1-1 database, to send messages.

2. PURPOSE

- 2.1. To outline tasks necessary for efficient and effective operations, including tasks associated with the transition from the current system to the FirstCall[®] system, and to assign responsibility for completion of such tasks.
- 2.2. To establish operational guidelines for the effective administration and use of the CAPCOG RNS.
- 2.3. To provide rules for uniform use of the CAPCOG RNS.
- 2.4. To provide information for continued quality assurance within the CAPCOG region.
- 2.5. To ensure adequate accounting of RNS activity.

3. **DEFINITIONS**

3.1. **Regional Program Administrator (RPA)**—A CAPCOG employee responsible for day-to-day operations of the overall CAPCOG RNS to include system access privileges, contract maintenance, quality assurance and quality improvement (QA/QI), system usage and accounting, and program training.

- 3.1.1. The RPA may designate assistants to aid in the program administration.
- 3.2. Local Program Administrator (LPA)—An employee of a participating jurisdiction/organization responsible for day to day operations of the RNS program on the local level to include system access privileges, QA/QI, system usage and accounting, and program training.

3.2.1. The LPA may designate assistants to aid in the program administration to include persons assigned to administer subaccounts of the jurisdiction/organization.

3.2.2. Each participating jurisdiction/organization will provide CAPCOG with the name and contact information of their LPA and all assistants.

3.2.3. The LPA and assistants will be the points-of-contact for the RPA in the administration of the CAPCOG RNS.

3.2.4. LPAs and assistants must complete a non-disclosure agreement regarding the 9-1-1 database.

- 3.3. Certified User—an individual who has been designated by the LPA to activate that part of the system that relies on the 9-1-1 database. Certified Users must have received training on the system and must complete a non-disclosure agreement regarding the 9-1-1 database. This agreement must be submitted to CAPCOG before the Certified User is granted access to that portion of the RNS that utilizes the 9-1-1 database.
- 3.4. **Restricted User**—an individual who has been designated by the RPA or LPA to activate any portion of the CAPCOG RNS that does not rely on the 9-1-1 database.
- 3.5. 9-1-1 Database—the list of telephone numbers and associated names and addresses that are collected by telephone service providers for use in the 9-1-1 emergency telephone system. State law (*Texas Administrative Code, Title 1, Part 12, Rule §252.13*) restricts use of the information in this database to the "purpose of warning or alerting citizens regarding information in an emergency situation where property or human life is in jeopardy".
- 3.6. **Open Source Data**—the list of names (persons/businesses), addresses, and phone numbers that are purchased by FirstCall Network, Inc. through open sources. This data is not subject to the regulations that govern the 9-1-1 data, and may be used for both emergency and non-emergency notifications. (It may also include email, SMS, social media, etc.)
- 3.7. **Registrant Data**—the list of names (persons/businesses), addresses and phone numbers of persons that elect to self-register personal information into the notification database. At the discretion of a participating jurisdiction and with the approval of the RPA, it may include persons who register for the State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry (STEAR) or similar programs. Although this data is not subject to the regulations that govern the 9-1-1 data, its use is limited to emergency notifications. (It may also include email, SMS, social media, etc.)

3.8. **User Data**—The list of names, addresses, phone numbers and other contact information for persons who have been identified as having a legitimate role related to the planning, response, recovery, and mitigation of emergencies or disasters. This may include information that is considered confidential under provisions of state law.

4. POLICY

4.1. Acceptable uses of the CAPCOG RNS

4.1.1. The CAPCOG RNS is funded by the Capital Area Emergency Communications District (CAECD) and its use is restricted to legitimate governmental activities. Any personal use or use for partisan political activities is strictly prohibited.

4.1.2. Because the FirstCall[®] system relies on a variety of databases, its use has been divided into four tiers:

4.1.2.1. **Tier I** utilizes the 9-1-1, Open Source, and Registrant databases for the purpose of "warning or alerting citizens regarding information in an emergency situation where property or human life is in jeopardy." Each person that accesses or initiates this level of notification must be a Certified User.

4.1.2.2. **Tier II** utilizes the Registrant and User databases to make notifications to members of the general public and personnel from participating jurisdictions/organizations related to Homeland Security activities. Federal and state laws extend this to all types of emergencies, both man-made and natural.

4.1.2.3. **Tier III** utilizes the Open Source database to make notifications for any governmental purpose. *NOTE: Tier III notifications must not be made between the hours of 8:00 PM and 8:00 AM.*

4.1.2.4. **Tier IV** utilizes the User databases to make notifications to members of the general public and personnel from participating jurisdictions/organizations for any governmental purpose.

4.2. CAPCOG shall:

4.2.1. Maintain a contractual relationship with FirstCall Networks, Inc., for operation of the CAPCOG RNS.

4.2.2. Designate the Regional Program Administrator (RPA).

4.2.3. The RPA is responsible for:

4.2.3.1. Providing credentials to the LPAs and validating the list of LPAs quarterly.

4.2.3.2. Providing or authorizing training for Certified Users.

4.2.3.3. Providing technical and procedural guidance for notification use and administration.

4.2.3.4. Provide training, including course materials, for all LPAs. This may be accomplished by conducting a Train-the-Trainer course for all or some of the jurisdictions/organizations.

4.2.3.5. Provide technical and procedural guidance for RNS use and administration.

4.2.3.6. Maintain administrator privileges on each subaccount created under the CAPCOG RNS.

4.3. Participating jurisdictions/organizations:

4.3.1. The FirstCall[®] application is available to any county or city in the CAPCOG region that has executed an agreement to participate in the CAPCOG RNS.

4.3.2. Other organizations that actively participate in the emergency management and emergency response activities of CAPCOG-member jurisdictions/organizations, including, but not limited to, emergency services districts, school districts and hospitals are eligible to apply to participate in the CAPCOG RNS. These organizations must execute an agreement to participate in the CAPCOG RNS and abide by the provisions of these policies and procedures.

4.3.3. Each jurisdiction/organization participating in the CAPCOG RNS shall:

4.3.3.1. Designate a Local Program Administrator and assistants, as needed, to serve as points of contact (POC) for CAPCOG for the purpose of administering the RNS, and notify CAPCOG immediately when the designated POC is no longer valid.

4.3.3.2. Assign unique User IDs and passwords for every person granted access to the CAPCOG RNS.

4.3.3.2.1. User IDs and passwords shall be issued only to employees and/or officials of the participating jurisdiction/organization.

4.3.3.2.2. User IDs and passwords shall not be shared by other persons and shall not be written or stored in locations that would be easily accessible by others.

4.3.3.2.3. In the event a user is no longer authorized to access and activate the RNS, the RNS credentials shall be terminated by the participating jurisdiction/organization in accordance with local policy.

4.3.3.3. Protect the confidentiality of addressing databases and of information furnished by 9-1-1 database providers, and notify CAPCOG's Director of Emergency Communications in writing within two business days of the receipt of a request for addressing databases or information, to include those made under the *Texas Public Information Act*.

Participating jurisdictions/organizations shall not release any information in response to such requests.

4.3.3.4. Notify the RPA within two business days of any request for information regarding the data housed in the FirstCall[®] notification system.

4.3.3.5. Execute an agreement to participate in the system stating that it will abide by these policies and procedures. This agreement will be for one year, effective on the date signed by CAPCOG and the organization, and will be automatically renewed unless cancelled in writing by either party.

4.4. Each Certified User shall :

4.4.1. Protect the confidentiality of 9-1-1 addressing databases and of information furnished by 9-1-1 database providers.

4.4.2. Sign and date the Nondisclosure Agreement and submit it to the RPA at the address indicated on the agreement. This form is available on-line at http://www.capcog.org/divisions/homeland-security/ens-docs/.

5. FUNDING

5.1. The CAECD will fund the following costs of the RNS:

5.1.1. CAPCOG personnel costs associated with operation and maintenance of the system;

- 5.1.2. Maintenance costs for system hardware and software; and
- 5.1.3. Costs of system enhancements.

EXHIBIT 1

RNS NONDISCLOSURE AGREEMENT FOR CERTIFIED USERS

- I, the undersigned, understand the sensitivity and confidentiality of the 9-1-1 database information that supports the CAPCOG Regional Notification System (RNS). I further realize that the potential for abuse of the RNS mandates that all Certified Users exercise extreme caution in granting access to the system, all of its components, and any derivative information or reports generated by it.
- Access to the RNS and related information is provided solely for the purposes of public safety by authorized personnel. Any other use is prohibited. Therefore, I agree to take reasonable precautions to prevent accidental or unauthorized access to the RNS, it's supporting documentation, related screen names and passwords, and any documents or reports (hardcopy or electronic) produced by the system.
- Account numbers, User IDs and Personal Identification Numbers (PIN) may not be disclosed to any third party. I understand and agree that any person requesting access to the System must contact the Regional Program Administrator or the Local Program Administrator, be trained on the system and be given their own User IDs and PINs.
- I will not copy, or permit anyone else to copy, any documentation (physical or electronic versions) of the RNS software or the output images unless the copying is required to support use of the system or official use archives.
- If I receive a request under the Texas Public Information Act for disclosure of any of the RNS 9-1-1 database information, I agree not to disclose the information, but instead to notify the Local Program Administrator (LPA) for my jurisdiction/organization who will follow procedures noted in Section 4.3.3.3 of the CAPCOG RNS Policies and Procedures.

Code of Ordinances § 92.02 reserves to the City the exclusive dominion, control and jurisdiction in, over, under, through, along, and across the streets and rights-of-way. Regulating parking clearly falls under this rubric. Chapter 70 would be a good location for the City's parking regulations, such as this one. You may consider amending Chapter 70 by adding a new "schedule" for Parking Regulations, as these do not neatly fit into any of the 3 existing schedules (I: Truck traffic; oversized vehicles; II: Stop and yield intersections, and III: Speed limits).

DIRECTIONAL SIGNS TO FOLLOW TMUTCD

The Woodcreek Code of Ordinances at § 152.05(C) defines "directional sign" in a way that is specifically inclusive of parking signs: "A sign which is separate from other signs, incidental and secondary to the principal use of the land on which it is located, and whose primary purpose is to give directions such as to parking lots, exits, entrances or drive-through windows, or directives such as 'no parking' or 'loading only'."

We should follow the directives of Part 2 of the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (TMUTCD), which regulates signs. See,

<u>http://www.txdot.gov/government/enforcement/signage/tmutcd.html</u>. The Manual, "contains Standards, Guidance, and Options for the signing of all types of highways, and private roads open to public travel." <u>Section 2A.01</u>.

COMPLY WITH APPROVED STANDARDS

The basic requirements of a sign are that it be **legible** to those for whom it is intended and that it be understandable in time to permit a proper response. Desirable attributes include:

- A. High visibility by day and night; and
- B. High legibility (adequately sized letters, symbols, or arrows, and a short legend for quick comprehension by a road user approaching a sign).

Standardized colors and shapes are specified so that the several classes of traffic signs can be promptly recognized. Simplicity and uniformity in design, position, and application are important.

[...]

All symbols shall be unmistakably similar to, or mirror images of, the adopted symbol signs, all of which are shown in the "Standard Highway Sign Designs for Texas" book (see Section 1A.11). Symbols and colors shall not be modified unless otherwise provided in this Manual. All symbols and colors for signs not shown in the "Standard Highway Sign Designs for Texas" book shall follow the procedures for experimentation and change described in Section 1A.10.

COMPLY WITH SPECIFIED REGULATORY SIGN STANDARDS

The Standard Highway Sign Designs for Texas may be found at <u>http://www.txdot.gov/government/enforcement/signage/highway-signs.html.html</u>. A sign similar to the one depicted in page 1-126, identified as "R7-112bR (L)," plus R-7-201aP or R7-201P, are probably a good candidate for the City's purposes:



On December 11, 2014, applicants Jack and Mary Kinkel, residing at 75 Woodcreek Drive, submitted an application for a variance to the Woodcreek Code of Ordnances, § 156.058 (B), to construct a fence on the back property line which is within 25 feet of the golf course easement. Notices to property owners within 200 feet for the public hearings of the application were mailed December 16, 2014.

The Kinkels wish to expand the use of their back yard, and provide an enclosed area for their dog. This situation meets the criteria of § 30.62(B)(1)(a), Yard and Fence Setbacks Permit, providing authority for a variance due to "irregular shape of the lot, topography or other conditions; provided that, such variance will not significantly affect any adjoining property or the general welfare of the community". The proposed fence would be on, rather than twenty-five feet from, the golf course property line. However, due to the aesthetic design and quality materials proposed, Quicksand Golf Course has conveyed its approval for construction of this type of fence on the property line.

Because the proposed action is consistent with the Quicksand Golf Course's efforts to improve course aesthetics, the City Staff finds no objection to the request. The Planning and Zoning Commission wished to table the issue until further discussion and resolution emerged in the City Council. When informed that action was required, the P&Z voted to disapprove 5-0-0.

On December 24, 2014, the City received a completed application from Charles Butler, owner of Lot 80, Woodcreek Section 6-B, for a variance to § 156.063 (A) (3) and § 156.063 (B) (1) (b) 1. of the Woodcreek Code of Ordinances for the rear setback of a proposed residential accessory structure to be offset by ten feet (10') rather than the fifteen feet (15') allowed for construction and by 10 feet rather than 25 feet for offset from the golf course property line. Notices to property owners within 200 feet for the public hearings of the application were mailed December 16, 2014.

Mr. Butler wishes to have the setback variance in order to allow construction of a workshop. The application does not describe the "unusual and practical difficulties or particular hardship" caused by the strict application of the Zoning Ordinance that § 30.62 (B) (1) (b) of the Woodcreek Code of Ordinances suggests is an appropriate factor for determination.

The views of all adjacent property owners have not been represented by the applicant, however the Quicksand Golf Course has supplied an instrument registering its consent. Because the proposed structure would not be visible from the golf course, City staff finds no objection to the application.


