# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WOODCREEK, TEXAS, REQUESTING A GRANT FROM THE LOWER COLORADO RIVER AUTHORITY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Woodcreek recently celebrated its thirtieth year of incorporation, notably without a public park; and

WHEREAS, in its thirtieth year the City rezoned acreage on two city-owned lots at the north intersection of Augusta Drive and Augusta Lane as the basis for a community pocket park herein referred to as the Augusta Park Project; and

WHEREAS, the benefits of pocket parks include supporting the overall ecology of the surrounding environment, helping protect the conserve local wildlife, landscape, and heritage, make communities safer and more sociable, and improve fitness and health; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) Community Development Partnership Program (CDPP) helps local governments and nonprofit organizations fund capital improvement projects to benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, the City of Woodcreek lies within the LCRA service area, and continues to be grateful for the LCRA CDPP grant that resulted in the construction of its present City Hall a decade ago; and

WHEREAS, the City hereby applies for a grant in the sum of \$21,315 from the LCRA CDPP to construct the Augusta Park Project; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the Augusta Park Project is to benefit the general public.

# Section 2-A: Project Narrative

# Organizational Overview

The City of Woodcreek was incorporated in 1984, making it one of the oldest incorporated cities in the Wimberley Valley and central Hays County. Surrounded by creeks, live oaks and abundant wildlife, Woodcreek is located in the midst of the Texas Hill Country. It has the best of two worlds – a peaceful rural setting with starlit skies at night and a residential neighborhood interwined with an 18-hole golf course. This quiet community consists of approximately 696 acres of land, which includes Brookmeadow, the original 18-hole Woodcreek golf course, the homes in what was originally called Woodcreek Resort Subdivision, the Oak Orchard Enclave and Camp Young Judaea. The City's 2010 Census Population was 1,457.

The community of Woodcreek recently celebrated its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a city and although it was originally a retirement community when established in the early 80s, the community is transitioning into a community with young families due to it's safe, affordable, friendly, and neighborly nature. One of the nicest characteristics of Woodcreek is the strong sense of community and neighborhood.

# **Project Overview**

Unfortunately, Woodcreek has no parkland! The city appointed a Parks and Recreation Committee in 2014 to review the current parks and recreation opportunities for the community and to make recommendations. The Parks committee has worked diligently to identify and plan the first City Park at Augusta Circle and Augusta Lane in Woodcreek – which will be called the Augusta Park Project. The wish is to focus on accommodating all ages from 6 to 96 and provide a park for the community and public to enjoy.

Two city-owned lots have been rezoned to provide a community park, also called a Pocket Park. Pocket parks are open spaces on a small-scale providing a safe and inviting environment for surrounding community members and visitors. Benefits of pocket parks include supporting the overall ecology of the surrounding environment, helping protect the conserve local wildlife, landscape, and heritage, make communities safer and more sociable, and improve fitness and health. The city plans to provide recreation and education at the park. The park plan includes construction of a Bocce Ball Court. Bocce is an inexpensive game of thought and strategy that brings families and friends together with the enjoyment of a game that all ages, tall or short, can play. The park will provide education and support environmental stewardship by including a demonstration Rain Garden. In addition, the park plan includes two picnic tables, stone benches, a parking area, and a sign reminding visitors to "Pack it in, Pack it out" to help keep the park clean.

In addition, the City of Woodcreek is part of the Cypress Creek Watershed Protection Plan (CCWPP) – which has a main goal to ensure that the long-term integrity and sustainability of the Cypress Creek watershed is preserved and that water quality

standards are maintained for present and future generations. The Rain Garden at the new park is the city's commitment to the watershed plan.

The goal of this park project is to provide a safe and inviting area to be used by the residents of the Woodcreek community and the public. The Augusta Park Project includes plans to identify native plants and remove invasive plants that do not provide a benefit to the environment. The City of Woodcreek and the Park committee are working with Master Naturalists and have community volunteers ready to get involved in the park project.

### How the Grant Will Be Used

The LCRA CDPP grant will be used to prepare and build the City of Woodcreek's first city park: the Augusta Park Project. The proposed project is going to cost \$30,035 and the City of Woodcreek is seeking a grant in the amount of \$21,325. Please see the attached quotes.

# Impact and Benefit to the Region

The park project will definitely have a positive impact on the City of Woodcreek and surrounding area as it will build community spirit, provide recreation and education, and support the environmental plan for the Cypress Creek Watershed Protection Plan.

# Who Will Maintain the Project

The City of Woodcreek will administer the grant and oversee the project execution from beginning to completion.

### **Project Funding**

The City of Woodcreek respectfully requests \$21,325 from the Lower Colorado River Authority CDPP to aid in the building of a park in Woodcreek for the community and public. The city will match the request with \$7,010 of their funds and an in-kind contribution of \$1,700 for a total project cost of \$30,035.

#### **Project Completion**

If CDPP grant funds are secured, the City of Woodcreek will initiate the Augusta Park Project with the goal of dedicating the community park at their October 2015 National Night Out Event in Woodcreek. The requested funds will enable completion of the project.
